


LITERATURE COURSE ORIENTATION

- Follow the teacher's directions immediately. Keep me happy and I'll do a better job for you!
- You must be ready to engage the class as soon as I enter the classroom. There is no time to waste in your schedule. Or mine.
 Even if you don't feel like it, your parents are paying for a service, and as professionals, we have to deliver.



 Attend to personal needs before class. I have been instructed not to give outdoors passes and to limit passes, so please do not ask for a pass unless you have a true emergency. I won't allow for other students requesting an audience with you to interrupt my class. Neither will I allow for you to leave the classroom to interrupt another class. Don't bother trying.



• Remain in your assigned seat unless you have a very good reason not to. I'll be the judge.

- Any utilization of cellphones is prohibited. No cellphones during class. Period. They must be out of sight as a rule of thumb. In case your parents need to contact you, due to a REAL EMERGENCY, they need to follow protocol by calling the school office, not you. The school will decide if it's worth interrupting the class to inform you.
- Never enter the teacher's working area without permission. People's spaces need to be respected.



- Never throw trash on the floor. NEVER. EVER. There is a waste basket. Use it. Just wait until the end of the period.
- Don't vandalize. Vandalism is idiotic and also a breach of the Code of Conduct. I've never seen anything that looks better after being scribbled, dented, stained, or broken. Would you look better if those things were done to you?
- Eating, drinking or using cell phones in the classroom is forbidden. As always.



- Bring required materials every day unless you are told otherwise. No sharing will be allowed in the classroom. EVER!
- Talk when appropriate. Be aware of the situation since quiet talking is allowed in some situations and speaking to the entire group without raising your hand may be allowed in others.
- Use polite speech and body language. Unkind teasing and impolite behavior towards ANYONE is unacceptable.

• Regarding testing, all my tests are **online tests**. The links will always be available at CO's LMS for you to access the tests. However, the tests will be taken on-site. You must have either a tablet or a laptop to take the tests. The school administration has forbidden the use of cellphones during testing. It is the student's responsibility to secure an approved device on the day of a test. You'll have the class's period to submit a test, unless you are entitled to an reasonable accommodation.



 Do not cheat. If you do, expect a ZERO, a referral to the Social Worker, and a phone call home. The student who shares his work for a test or an independent assignment AND the person who copies it will suffer the same consequences. Do your own work and to be sure no one can copy it.
