



# WITH GREAT POWER COMES... BEING A JERK



The world of the ancient Greeks and Romans was populated with gods and goddesses. Although these supernatural beings had more authority than people, they were portrayed as experiencing human emotions such as jealousy and passion.

## Myths

#### Cause and Effect

To evaluate cause and effect, you look for a logical relationship between causes and effects. Transitional or signal words and phrases indicate cause and effect and include one cause, another effect, as a result, consequently, and therefore. You must determine whether the causes and effects in a text are reasonable. Use a Cause-and-Effect Chart, like the one here, to recognize two more relationships between causes and effects.



As you read, look for the features that make "Echo & Narcissus" a myth. When you have finished the story, consider the purpose of such tales in a society that had little understanding of science and in which most people could not read or write. Think, too, of why the myths appeal to modern readers.
