FUMETTI PROJECT 2018 PROTOCOL

INTRODUCTION	<p>A fumetti is a type of sequential art (photo novel or comic book) using photos or film stills instead of artwork along with the narrative text and word balloons containing dialogue. Fumetti is an Italian word (literally "little puffs of smoke" in reference to speech balloons), which refers to all sequential art.</p>
CONTENT	<p>Working cooperatively, students will visit http://jimsoto.weebly.com/world-history.html and click on any of the MYTH RESOURCES in the page in order to access a great variety of myths to choose one to adapt into a story in 7-10 pages with <u>no less than 3</u> photos per page. One "splash" page (page with only one photograph) will be allowed. The fumetti's cover must include a "magazine-like" image, a title, homeroom number, and the names (only) of all contributors.</p> <p>The project can be done entirely using Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, or Publisher and then converted into a PDF to be sent to the teacher's e-mail (jsoto@fbspr.com). A hardcopy of the work must <u>also</u> be furnished on the project's due date.</p> <p>Student teams will recreate the story of their choice through photographs and word balloons. Costumes, sets, and props must suit the selected story. Attention should be given to proper lighting, camera angles, and photographic composition in order to make the work look as good as it can. Parents can help by furnishing students with the resources necessary to the development of this project (e.g. cameras, costumes, transportation, pizza...) However; they must NOT have a hand in the making of the fumetti.</p> <p>Eventually, this project will be exhibited at an activity that will take place next semester.</p>
EVALUATION CRITERIA	<p>A rubric will be used in the evaluation of your project will be using the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Myth is presented in an accurate, concise, logical sequence, and evidences a clear plot structure.• Consistent, easy to read text.• Graphics are appropriate and relate to content.• Correct grammar is evident.• Each student did an amount of work equal to that of his/her team mates.• There should be a credit section on the last page stating the contributions of all team members. <p>Be reminded that although the project is collaborative, each student must pull his/her weight to earn a grade. Team leaders must make sure all team assets have specific duties that are equal to that of the rest of the team.</p> <p>This project has a value of 100 pts. The project's due date is October 12, 2018.</p>
