Rules	<ol> <li>Script must be a professionally formatted (Courier or Courier New font, size 12, etc.) five page screenplay authored by all team members.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li><u>All</u> elements of the Syd Field Paradigm must be indefinable. A paradigm map should be attached to the script.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Scripts can make use of any fantastic genre or combination thereof.</li> </ol>
	4. Scripts must be <b>shootable</b> .
	5. In keeping with proper societal standards; scripts with nudity, language, sexual content, or strong violence are prohibited.
