Content	 The project consists of a recorded PowerPoint slide show presentation you will create and present about an author of your choice in video form. You can use Zoom, Screencastify, or any similar app to record your presentation. A list of authors from different American literary movements will be furnished to make your choice easy*. Your video will be sent to the teacher's email on or before the due date. In the presentation you will provide information of the author's personal life, work, and literary contributions. Students will present their project on the date of their choice. Only one presentation per day will be allowed beginning on the date designated by the teacher. A time frame of 5 to 7 minutes will be allotted for each slide show. The presentation page must include the title of the slide show, student's full name, the homeroom number, and the teacher's name. The slide show must have between 10 and 14 slides. The project must include a list of three (3) references in the last slide. Plagiarism will be severely sanctioned.
Evaluation Criteria	 A rubric will be used in the evaluation of your project will be using the following criteria: Information is presented in an accurate, concise, logical sequence. Consistent, easy to read text. Graphics are appropriate and relate to content. Correct grammar is evident. The graphics, sound and/or animation assist in presenting an overall theme and enhance understanding. Sources of information are properly cited so that the audience can determine the credibility/authority of the information presented. Correct time frame was used.
